A.C.C. Approval

Any Resident planning to change the exterior of their property must obtain approval from the A.C.C. Chairman. North Strabane Township will not issue a building permit to any resident of Glencannon unless they have this approval from the association. Approval must be obtained for decks, doors, windows, sidewalks, patios, sheds, painting, etc.

A \$50 fine may be assessed for failure to submit the ACC form with proper approval.

Selling Your Property?

If you are planning to sell your property you will need a "Resale Certificate" signed by a GHA Board Member and the GHA Secretary. The Resale Certificate is issued when all GHA dues and assessments have been received by GHA resulting in a zero balance owed. The Resale Certificate is required for your home Closing.

As a reminder under Act 180, the Association has ten days to provide the Resale Certificate and other items to the seller. Please contact the GHA Secretary as soon as possible so that your Resale Certificate can be prepared.

There is a fee of \$75 for a Resale Certificate.

Attorney Fee Policy

Residents who fail to pay the monthly \$43 assessment for five months or more can expect an official warning letter from Glencannon Homes Association. Failure to respond will result in a letter from the Glencannon Attorney and a \$100 letter drafting fee will be added to the amount owed. Homeowners that force the Attorney file a lien on their property (for lack of payment) will also have those fees added to their account.

Resident question of the month How much cheaper was County Hauling than Republic? We should return to Republic as County does not take glass and it is unsafe.

GHA is saving a substantial amount of money (otherwise we would have to increase dues) by utilizing the services of County Hauling which meets or exceeds the industry standards that are set by various government entities. They (and all other refuse companies) do not accept glass because of the changing status of the industry both country-side as well as world-wide. One major factor includes China significantly lowering the percentage of "dirty" recyclables that they will accept. Glass is a major contributor to dirty recyclables as it can break and shatter in transit.

Playgrounds and courts will re-open <u>AFTER</u> the self-distancing guidelines have been lifted. Please educate your children on safe social-distancing practices.

Dog Laws

Please remember that Pennsylvania and the township of North Strabane have laws pertaining to DOGS.

Pennsylvania State Law: All dogs must be under control and may not be allowed to run at large. Dogs are personal property and owners are responsible for damages caused by their dogs. This means that when your dog is not on your property, it must be under direct control of you or a handler. The best way to control your dog is with a leash.

North Strabane Township Ordinance:

It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog or dogs to allow or permit such dog or dogs to run at large in the township of North Strabane.

We ask that all residents please clean up after your pets. Thank you for your cooperation.

Glencannon ACC regulations require that GARBAGE CONTAINERS are to be stored indoors or inconspicuously outdoors (not in front of your residence).

Garbage containers should be placed at the curb no earlier than 5:00 p.m. the night before collection day,

and must be removed the next day.

Glencannon Pond Repairs – Project Status Update

Permit Applications:

- a) Township Grading Permit a copy of the Stormwater Consistency Letter from the Township Engineer. Harshman will need to follow up with the Township with copies of the approved permits from DEP, WCCD, etc. once they have been obtained. There will be a permit fee to pick up the permit from the Township.
- b) Joint Permit Application (DEP) The Environmental Due Diligence report has been submitted to DEP supporting clean fill. CP Contracting Company who has an import site in the Finleyville area that would be able to take the dredge material that needs disposed of. Signatures are needed for the FP-001 form for clean fill.
- c) Joint Permit Application (DOA) DEP will forward the Department of the Army a copy of the info regarding the disposal location and clean fill determination for the project.
- d) NPDES (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) Permit The Stormwater Consistency Letter provided by the Township Engineer has been provided to the WCCD and DEP for review. We are awaiting a response from them.
- e) Chapter 105 Dam Amendment/Authorization Letter & Dam Permit DEP Comments received for the dam permit have mostly been addressed. The only remaining comment that needs addressed is the finalized revision of the Emergency Action Plan (EAP). The EAP has been submitted to the County & Township for review and signatures. The Township has signed off on the EAP we are waiting to receive a signed copy from the County. Once the County signs off on the EAP, it will be submitted to PEMA and DEP for review and signatures. Once the EAP has received all signatures and has been finalized, a comment response will be provided to DEP addressing their comments.
- f) General Permit 7 (GP-7) Approved by WCCD.

Miscellaneous:

- a) Once all permits have been obtained, we can start preparing the bid package and bidding the project.
- b) Currently the goal is to aim for construction in the Summer of 2020 assuming all permits have been obtained by then. The dam permit may be a source of delay as it is waiting on a finalized version of the EAP which is still be reviewed by various agencies. It is possible COVID-19 could delay this.
- c) The field behind 101 Hunting Creek Road has been evaluated as a disposal location, and while it can be used to dispose of some of the material after proper preparation, it will not sustain all of it.

Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

Know How it Spreads

- There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.
- The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person. Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
- Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.
- These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.

Take steps to protect yourself

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Put distance between yourself and other people if COVID-19 is spreading in your community. This is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.

Take steps to protect others

- Stay home if you are sick, except to get medical care. Learn what to do if you are sick.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or use the inside of your elbow.
- Throw used tissues in the trash.
- Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean your hands with a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- If you are sick: You should wear a facemask when you are around other people.
- If you are NOT sick: You do not need to wear a facemask unless you are caring for someone who is sick (and they are not able to wear a facemask). Facemasks may be in short supply and they should be saved for caregivers.

Clean and disinfect

- Clean AND disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.
- If surfaces are dirty, clean them: Use detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection.
